



INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENT STUDY ALTERNATIVES AVAILABLE FOR REVIEW

The City of Aurora is conducting an intersection improvement study focused on evaluating and recommending operational improvements to the Parker Road and Smoky Hill intersections along Quincy Avenue.

The goals of transportation improvements recommended by this study are to reduce congestion and improve operations and safety. The study will identify relatively low-cost improvements that may be implemented in the near term.

Using community input received surrounding the study's first public meeting in October 2015, more than 20 alternatives were developed and evaluated. The alternatives evaluation completed to date will be presented at the March 3rd public meeting. Final recommendations will be presented at a third public meeting in Spring 2016.

Input gathered at this meeting will be used to shape the study recommendations. The project team looks forward to your input!
